NATIONAL ARCHAEOLOGICAL MUSEUM & MONASTIRAKI

The National Archaeological Museum is the most important archaeological museum in Greece and one of the richest in the world concerning ancient Greek art. Its collections are representative of all the cultures that flourished in Greece. The museum contains collections of Prehistoric items, Sculpture, Pottery and Minor art, Bronzes, Egyptian Art. After the two hour guided tour in the Museum you will depart to Monastiraki which is, without a doubt, one of the most famous regions of Athens. For Athens' residents and visitors alike, Monastiraki is a very popular destination and meeting point, either for lunch or dinner in one of its outdoor taverns, or for a walk around the antique shops, situated in the alleys around the square. Its name refers to something related with religion (Monastiraki = small monastery), but not even many Athenians know where it got its name from. There you will have the time to do some shopping and have a typical Greek lunch (souvlaki) in one of the taverns round main square.
